Bramham Shadwell Federation Class R April - May 2021



All our learning in class this half term will be focused around the question:

Can I make a difference?

Communication, Language and Literacy	Mathematical Development
 The focus will be on learning about 'Dinosaurs'. We will be reading a range of fiction and non-fiction books. The children will be retelling familiar stories and poems. Each day the children will be encouraged and motivated to write during focused lessons and during independent play. The children will be taught how to complete the green and pink pen challenge against the everyday success criteria: To say our sentence out loud; to use finger spaces and to use full stops. All children will continue to read to an adult both in group reading sessions and individually. Writing: All children are now expected to write a simple sentence with greater independence. They will practise this through weekly news writing. We will also be beginning to develop our story writing skills. This will focus around stories we have become familiar with during this half term. All children will participate in handwriting sessions with a focus on accurate letter formation. The texts we will focus on are: That's Not My Dinosaur, Harry and the Bucket Full of Dinosaurs, Dinosaur Roar, Dinosaurs (nonfiction), 10 Little Dinosaurs, Dinosaurs Love Underpants 	 The focus will be on recognising and ordering numbers to 20. We will introduce 2 digit numbers beginning with a focus on the number 10. The children will begin to understand what 1 ten is through the Numberblocks 10 episode. We will continue to develop our quick recall of 1 more and 1 less than a given number. We will begin to count in 2's using practical equipment like shoes to support this. We will also be improving our rapid recall of number bonds (<i>how many ways do you know to make 5, 6 etc</i>). This involves the children saying a sentence e.g. 3 add/ plus 2 equals 5 or 3 and 2 more makes 5. We will continue to encourage the children to record mathematical problems and patterns using their choice of mathematical graphics. The children will continue to develop their mathematical language when talking about 2D (<i>sides, corners, flat</i>) and 3D shapes (<i>faces, edges, vertices, solid</i>) We will explore measuring including capacity using a range of equipment. We will introduce time with a focus on everyday language (<i>today, tomorrow, morning, afternoon etc</i>) The children will continue to explore pattern.
How can I help / information for helping Share a variety of books at home with your child. Ask your child to re-read a sentence to build up fluency. Discuss vocabulary with your child from their reading book. Practise accurate letter formation If your child is writing at home, please encourage them to start their letters in the correct place.	How can I help / information for Helping Work on recognition of numbers to 20. Spot and discuss 2D and 3D shapes in the local environment. Practise counting in 2's. This might be counting the number of legs in your family or counting pairs of socks in the washing basket. Practise accurate number formation

Each day we will choose two children to be our 'VIPs of the Day'. The VIPs will be in charge of special jobs in class. Special Assembly will continue to take place every Friday. The circle times will focus on relevant issues and discussion points brought up by the children. If there is anything you would like us to cover during these sessions linked to personal, social and emotional development, please let us know.	In PE the focus will be on multi-sports. The children will be learning how to throw and catch balls and beanbags competently. They will compete in a number of games individually and as a team. We will continue to provide fine motor activities within the classroom for the children to access. These will be related to our dinosaur topic and will help the children improve their pencil control.
