Minibeasts

Communication, Language and Literacy	Mathematical Development
 The focus will be on learning about Minibeasts. The children will find out and discuss what they know about Minibeasts and what they want to find out. We will be reading a range of fiction and non-fiction books. The children will be retelling familiar stories and poems. All children will continue to read to an adult both in-group reading sessions and individually. Writing: All children are now expected to write at least one simple sentence with greater independence. They will practise this through weekly news writing and challenges. We will also be beginning to develop our story writing skills. This will focus around stories we have become familiar with during this half term. All children will participate in handwriting sessions with a focus on accurate letter formation. 	 We will continue to develop our quick recall of 1 more and 1 less than a given number. The children will be practising to count on or back from a given number to find the total. In class we tap the largest number on our head and then count back/ on using our fingers. We will also be improving our rapid recall of number bonds 3 to 10 (how many ways do you know to make 5, 6 etc). The children will continue to develop their mathematical language when talking about 2D (sides, corners, flat) and 3D shapes (faces, edges, vertices, solid)
How can I help / information for helping Share a variety of books at home with your child. Ask your child to re-read a sentence to build up fluency. Discuss vocabulary with your child from their reading book. Use non-fiction books to find information. Practise accurate letter formation When your child is writing at home, please encourage them to start their letters in the correct place.	How can I help / information for Helping Practise saying 1 more and 1 less than a given number to 20. Play with dice: add two dice together by counting on from the largest number/ How many different ways can you roll 6? Continue to spot 3D and 2D shapes. Can the children name them and describe their properties? Ask your child to help you with number problems (I have 3 strawberries, how many more do I need to make 8?)

Phonics Beginning to look at Phase 5 sounds, as well as consolidating phase 3 and 4 sounds and words: Phase 5 Sound Mat We will also be continuing to practise our blending and segmenting skills in order to read and write words. Tricky words: These are our new tricky words this half term. The VIPs will be in charge of special jobs in class. Special Assembly will continue to take place every Friday. This assembly is for the 'Star of the Week'. We will continue to provide fine motor activities within the classroom for the children to access. These will help the children improve their pencil and scissor control.
