<p>Classes will operate in class ‘bubbles’ with designated staffing. Contact with other ‘bubbles’ across the school will be minimised.</p>	<p>There will be staggered start and end times to the school day to avoid congestion</p> <p>Times will be in two waves: Wave 1 8:45-3:15 Nur, Rec, Y1, Y2 (Ormerod) Wave 2 9:00-3:30 Y3, Y4, Y5, Y6 (Clapgate)</p>
<p>‘Bubbles’ will have designated spaces including learning spaces, toilets, outdoor play spaces and lunch slots.</p>	<p>The curriculum will be adapted to meet the needs of pupils with a focus on developing hygiene routines and effective learning behaviours.</p>
<p>The classroom layout will be adapted</p> <p>The environment will be set up to reduce the amount of time pupils have face to face contact with each other and staff.</p>	<p>Children will be expected to wear school uniform</p> <p>They can bring a bag, own PE kit and a lunch box if required. KS2 can bring their own pencil cases or use the stationery provided.</p>
<p>Cleaning and personal hygiene remains essential</p> <p>Pupils and staff will continue to regularly wash and sanitise their hands. Surfaces and spaces, including items such as door handles, desks and equipment will be cleaned throughout the school day.</p>	<p>Absences must be reported to the school office</p> <p>School attendance is compulsory for all pupils from September. If a pupil is not coming into school, absences must be reported in the usual way, by 9:30am at the latest. Leave of absence without permission may result in the issuing of Education Penalty Notice fines of £60 per parent per child.</p>
