COVID-19 Update

Last night, during the Prime Minister's briefing, it was confirmed that schools would be reopening from Monday 1st June for pupils in Year R, Year 1 and Year 6. We are expecting approximately 100 children on Monday but please remember that if you have not signed your child up for a space then you do not come to the school as we will not have a place for your child.

The whole staff team have been working exceptionally hard to ensure that school is ready for these children on Monday and just before the half-term holiday, I sent out a letter regarding what this will look like in practice. If you have not already done so, please look at the **School Closure: Phased Return** page on our school website.

As I wrote last week, we will be evaluating our plan and then making any necessary changes. Once these are done, we will be writing to parents again to see if there are any families who wish to send their children in from Monday 15th June. We felt that it was important that the changes made have a chance to establish and be tested before adding more children to the 'mix' which is why we are accepting new children on a fortnightly basis.

During this period of partial closure, staff have been undertaking online training, responding to parent emails and holding individual Zoom calls with children as well as planning and supporting home-learning. Now that all staff are back in school full-time (and in many cases teaching children who are not 'their' class) there is not the same level of capacity and I would ask that this is recognised if you need to contact your child's class teacher.

Key Workers

Please continue to complete the weekly Google Form as we will need to know numbers for Breakfast and After-School Club. The Google Form for the 8th June is below and it would be helpful if this was completed by next Thursday.

If you are a key worker and are accessing our Breakfast and After-School Club, then children can be dropped off and picked up from the school office. If you are not using Breakfast & After-School Club then please enter school through the playground with everyone else.

At the beginning of the day, children will join their small groups unless parents have asked that they remain in the key worker group.

Return of Years 2 to 5

I've had a couple of parents contact me about the return of other year groups. I am sorry to say that I have no information about this at the moment. The government still maintains that it wants to see these children in school before the summer holiday but the current guidance of class sizes of 15 is in direct contrast to this.

As soon as I hear anything I will let you know.

Library News


