Dear Parents/Carers,

This week, most of my time has been spent talking to parents of Year 6 children about secondary school choices and the Kent Test. Understandably, this is an anxious time for parents and children alike with the unavoidable delays not making the situation any easier. However, as I talk to parents, the message that is coming through very clearly is that children are calm, relaxed and in a position to do their best.

I'm also pleased to hear that this is being reflected in the conversations that have been taking place between parents and staff over the past two weeks. Our parental consultations have been very much focused on children's emotional wellbeing and their resilience rather than the gaps in their learning – especially in this early stage of return.

Whilst no-one would question the importance of addressing the gaps in learning that may have arisen over lockdown, it is heartening that we all recognise that the children's mental and emotional health need to come first.

Harvest Celebrations

Over the course of the week, the children have been considering the season of Harvest and we are putting together a 'virtual' Collective Worship, including contributions from all classes, that we will be sharing with the children next week. Look out for a report on our school website next week!
