Dear Parents/Carers,

It's a shortened version of the newsletter this week to go along with the shortened week itself and what a week it has been! You will be aware that we have had a sudden increase in COVID cases in our families and this appears to have been primarily driven by secondary-aged-pupils, which is in line with what is being seen across the country.

If numbers do continue to rise nationally and locally (which is quite likely) then we may need to reintroduce some of the protective measures that were put into place previously. No one wants to see the return of 'bubbles' or remote learning but, if we get a significant number of cases in a particular year group then this may well have to happen.

These past few days have been a stark reminder of the risk that COVID still poses. The impact of the positive diagnoses has disrupted school, which has obviously been an inconvenience but more seriously, we still have vulnerable children and adults in our community and we need to do everything we reasonably can to protect them.

Whilst I am writing this, I have a member of my family who is unwell with COVID despite being double-jabbed and I had a conversation with a friend of mine earlier in the week who was ill with it a few weeks ago and described it as *'going through chemotherapy all over again'*. I am grateful that most of the cases I am aware of in school are mild but this highlights to me that we must remain vigilant and not allow ourselves to be complacent, especially as we approach the winter months.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all parents for their ongoing support. Whilst we have had a few cases this week, until now, Bridge School has been relatively untouched by COVID and I hope that we can continue in this vein next term.

Harvest Festival

I spent the morning down at St. Peter's Church with Rev. Estella, Mrs Perfect and Mr Miles and was witness to three very impressive Harvest Worships. This year the children have been learning about and considering Climate Change and Climate Injustice and they had written some very thoughtful reflections and prayers. They also had considered how best to support our environment and the small actions that we can take as individuals such as turning off lights in rooms that are not being used; considering what produce and foods we buy or making sure that car engines are turned off when we are parked.

As we were unable to invite parents, I did take some video clips of the children who read along with a few short snippets of the children singing. My plan is to post these on our school Vimeo account and send parents the relevant links. You will not be able to see these videos without the relevant links so anyone searching for these videos on our website or Vimeo account will not find them there.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your generosity in supporting the Foodbank and we will be delivering your donations tomorrow.
