COVID Update

Over the past week, I have written to parents twice already to update you on our protocols following guidance from DfE and you can also find these on the **COVID-19 Protocols** section of our school website. Can I, in particular, draw your attention to the section on face coverings? If you are in a group of people and especially if you are speaking face-to-face, then you should be wearing a face covering.

I would also like to highlight one piece of guidance I have received today that since the Omicron variant appears to be affecting the upper airways then it is advisable to do a throat swab as well as nostrils when doing an LFD test. This advice comes from Dr Matt Butler (a consultant from the COVID Assessment Unit at Cambridge University Hospitals).
