#### Dear Parents/Carers,

I'd like to start the newsletter this week with some welcome news – arriving a little earlier than planned, Mr Wren's daughter was born on Wednesday and I'm very pleased to report that Mum, baby and Dad are all doing well. We now await with bated breath the arrival of Mr Taylor's bundle of joy who, by contrast, has decided that 'fashionably late' is the order of the day!

## COVID Update

You will have seen that, from yesterday, face masks are no longer statuatory in classrooms in secondary schools although I am aware that at least one local secondary school is still requesting that masks are still worn for the time being. Whilst some will be pleased with the end of the Plan B restrictions, I would still recommend caution. Cases may be dropping nationally but there is one age group in which they are rising – 6 to 11 year olds!

As I write this, we have about 5% of our children self-isolating with COVID. This is much lower than other local schools but we are now starting to see reinfections occuring and I speak from personal experience here as my daughter tested positive again last night having have COVID just seven weeks ago. This means that we cannot assume that just because someone has had COVID, they won't get it again.

Staff in school will continue to wear face coverings outside of the classsroom and we ask that visitors and volunteers do the same.


Each Friday, we celebrate children who have impressed the adults in school either through their learning or demonstrating one of our Christian values.
