Dear Parents/Carers,

In what has been a tricky week, let's start with some great news!

I'm very pleased to let you all know Mr and Mrs Taylor welcomed their baby daughter on Tuesday. The family are all doing well and Mr Taylor is now enjoying his paternity leave – thankfully avoiding the sudden increase in COVID cases that we've experienced this week.

COVID Update

To coincide with the relaxation of restrictions, we have had a sharp increase in COVID numbers this week. These have primarily been focused in two specific classes initially and then into Year R. This tallies with the national picture where the greatest increase is seen in the primary school-age bracket.

As I mentioned earlier this week, the newer cases of COVID do not seem to displaying the 'typical' symptoms identified on the gov.uk website but rather the **children and adults testing positive are reporting sore throats and headaches** so please could I ask that parents are alert to these additional symptoms.

If you do have access to LFD tests (which I know is an issue in itself!), I would advocate regular testing of your children whilst we are in this 'spike' and I hope that things return to a more 'normal' level soon. If you have any cases, please report them either direct to me or via ParentMail (I can access this over the weekend).

White Rose Maths

Mrs Cork has asked me to highlight an new app from White Rose Maths (which we use in school) called 1-Minute Maths. I would recommend that all parents download this and get their children using this regularly.

How does it work?

1-Minute Maths offers children engaging and easily accessible practice in basic number. There's no specific route or starting point. Having chosen a topic, each user answers a series of randomly generated questions (a different set of questions every time means they learn the concept, not a sequence of answers).

When the one minute's up, the questions are automatically marked and presented on a breakdown screen, giving instant feedback on how they've done. If they're struggling with a question, a 'Hint' button reformats the question as a familiar manipulative display that mirrors the approaches used in the White Rose Maths schemes of learning.
