Dear Parents/Carers,


I trust that you all enjoyed the half-term break. I know that some families were impacted by COVID but thankfully numbers have continued to drop. I have had very positive feedback about the Buzzers holiday club that operated over teh half-term and am pleased to say that they will also be offering an Easter club for these two weeks (with the exception of Good Friday) – more details closer to the time.

### COVID Update

This week started with the Prime Minister updating the country on the strategy for 'living with COVID' and we have been awaiting more specific guidance for schools which was published yesterday. Despite the announcement, very little has changed for schools: <u>COVID-19 Protocols</u> | <u>Bridge & Patrixbourne CEP School</u>

- Staff no longer have access to twice weekly LFD tests;
- Staff and children displaying symptoms are still asked to get tested and public health guidance is that you they stay at home and isolate whilst waiting for the result;
- Staff and children displaying any of the key symptoms of COVID-19 should not attend school in order to protect others from infection.

There will be an update to this guidance after 1<sup>st</sup> April when the majority of free testing will end.





### World Book Day

A reminder that on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> March, we will be taking part in World Book Day. We have not been able to do this for the past couple of years but children are invited to come into school dressed as a character from a book.


Each Friday, we celebrate children who have impressed the adults in school either through their learning or demonstrating one of our Christian values.
