Dear Parents/Carers,

As we reach the end of parental consultations, I trust that you have all found these useful and a good starting point to frame any discussions for the year ahead and I'm particularly pleased that these are back to being face-to-face after the past couple of years.

Trips and Visits

As part of our curriculum, we try to get as many 'experiences' for the children as we can, be they visitors coming into school or walks around the village. As we have two minibuses (subsidised by the PTA), the cost of these trips is greatly reduced and we will be making every effort to keep any associated costs low.

What we do need from parents is some support to help with adult ratios on any trips we do, particularly in the lower year groups where we ideally need 4 or 5 adults per class! If you think that you may be able to help with this, then please let the school office know and we can arrange for the necessary safeguarding checks (these are free!)

Can I just say a big thank you to those parents who were able to support the Year 1 trip this week.

Bridge PTA Fireworks

Another event that I'm pleased is back on the agenda is the Bridge Fireworks Display. On Thursday, the PTA met to go through final arrangements.

Tickets will be on sale by the end of next week and will be priced at £8 per adult and £4 per child with a family ticket (2 adults, 2 children) costing £20. We are very aware of pressures on peoples' finances at the moment and so have kept the cost the same as it was in 2019.

Next week, a plea from the PTA will be coming home for volunteers to support with this event – they will be looking for volunteers to help set up during the day, at the event itself and clear-up on Sunday morning.

If you are able to help, then it will be appreciated. This is the PTA's big fundraising event of the year and after two years of absence, it would be great to reestablish this community event.

Bugs

It is getting to that time of year when children (and adults) are more prone to catching bugs, colds, etc. and we have had to send a couple of children home this week with vomiting. In order to try and prevent transmission of these bugs, can I just remind parents that children presenting with vomiting and/or diarrhoea should be kept off school for 48 hours. The NHS website Is my child too ill for school? is a useful resource if you are unsure whether your child should be in school or not.



If there are dates of other events you would like to know then please ask and we will publish these as well.








Should I keep my

child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
