Year R Outside Area

This is short notice but we've only found out ourselves in the past few days.

Next week, work will begin on the replacement of the doors, windows in Year R and the exterior canopy. This will inevitably mean a great deal of disruption, particularly for the Year R classes. We are hoping to get all this completed over the Christmas Holidays but sadly this has not been possible.

From Monday, there will be no access outside the Year R classrooms. This means that Year R parents will need to drop their children off on the Key Stage 2 playground and then the Year R children will be walked around to their classes. Children will also need to be collected from this same area. The Key Stage 2 playground can be accessed from the bottom gate, i.e. through the staff car park.

From Monday to Wednesday, the current canopy will come down and then on Thursday the work to replace the windows starts. If all goes to plan (and why wouldn't it!) then by the 23rd Decemebr, we'll have new windows, doors and a canopy!

I realise that this is not ideal but this is the final step in getting our Year R classrooms back to capacity after the fire in the summer and it will all be worth it when completed.

BASC Availability

A few weeks ago I wrote in the newsletter that we were struggling to meet the demand for after-school club especially on particular days. Whilst historically, we have had a nominal capacity of 70 – we are now in a position where we have have no option but to reduce this.

From Monday, the BASC registers for the spring term will go live and the **number will be capped at 60 children** per evening. After Christmas, we will not be accepting any bookings that take us above 60 children. If you ned BASC after Christmas, then I would advise parents to book their sessions ASAP.
