Dear Parents/Carers,

This week we were very pleased to see Mrs Allen back in school who spent a couple of days with the Year 6 children ahead of her return to work. She'll be in again on Tuesday and, after the February half-term break, she will be teaching Year 6 on a Thursday and a Friday.

I've also been spending more time in lessons this week: I was pleased to see Year 3 learning about multiplication and division this week and even saw an RE lesson where the children were learning about the baptism of Jesus. My favourite part of the week was seeing Forest School in action with 2SA on Wednesday – they were so excited to be learning about bats and they even managed to teach me a thing or two!

Strike Action: Update

I am writing to all parents to update you regarding the strike action declared by the NEU which will be taking place next week (Wednesday 1stFeb) as well as three further dates in March.

As things currently stand, no teachers at Bridge School have informed me that they will be taking strike action. This means that, currently, the school will be open for all pupils on Wednesday and everyone should attend school as normal.

I should point out, however, that this does not preclude the possibility of strike action taking place in March or even at a future point in the year - especially as I note that the NASUWT and NAHT have announced that they are to reballot their members.

In the teacher community, both in school and wider afield, there is such a broad range of opinions. However, I strongly believe we must trust that each individual has made their decision based upon what they feel is best for the children in their care - this should be recognised and respected as such.
