An Audience with Hari Budha Magar

Many of our families will know Hari as he has been a parent at the school for a great number of years now. A few weeks ago, Hari delivered a talk at the Malthouse and I had a couple of parents contact me asking what we could do to support him.

Hari lost both of his legs whilst serving in the Royal Gurkha Rifles and is now challenging himself to be the first double-above-knee amputee to climb Mt. Everest. In aid of his fund-raising, he speaks about inspiring people to fulfil their own dreams and to raise awareness of disability. I know that that the event at the Malthouse was well-recieved and Hari has offered to come and speak to both our children and adults within school.



This is an opportunity to hear Hari share his incredible story and how he plans to conquer Everest later this year and it is not to be missed.

Normally tickets for events such as this would be sold for approx. £20, however Hari has kindly recognised that some of our families may be struggling with increased costs at the moment and has agreed to sell tickets at a reduced cost of just £10 a head – you are able to purchase tickets via ParentMail and parents are also able to optionally purchase the tickets at their full value of £20. The PTA will also be selling refreshments on the evening and all proceeds (tickets and drinks) will go towards Hari's expedition.

Tickets will be limited as we only have capacity for just over 100 people in the hall and can be purchased on ParentMail.
