#### ArtsMark Gold

Whilst on the topic of extra opportunities... You will know that we do a great deal of Art at Bridge School and we invest heavily in this area of the curriculum. A couple of years ago, we started working toward the ArtsMark and I am pleased to be able to share that we were awarded 'Gold' for the quality of work that we do.

Revisions to your curriculum have ensured that it is well-sequenced so that you have seen improvements in the planning and teaching, with a focus on creating immersive opportunities through a broad and balanced curriculum and pupils' progression in skills. Children regularly showcase their achievements in the Arts in performances, recitals, at Young Voices and in your Summer Festival.

Your offer includes visits to arts venues and a wide range of opportunities to participate in exciting workshops, led by arts professionals. Your growing partnerships with arts and culture venues and professionals have inspired projects helping children to feel connected to their locality (such as your 'Murmurations' exploration of Folkestone bird migration in alliance with Creative Folkestone), and these have had measurable impacts on standards and on the engagement of pupils with SEND.

Your specialist arts leaders have been fruitful in strengthening teaching through coaching and continuing professional development, raising the profile of arts subjects within the school and boosting teachers' confidence. On this Artsmark journey, you have begun to consider diversity in and through the Arts ... so that your pupils are now being introduced to a wider range of artists, musicians and cultural traditions."

I am exceptionally proud of all of our work in the creatives arts and music and it is heartening to have this recognised and celebrated. Huge thanks to all the staff but particularly Mrs C Smith, Mrs Tomsett, Mr Miles and Mrs H Brookes.

Parents will be aware of the pressure on school finances but, now more than ever, I feel strongly that we need to protect the creative arts at school.

#### Year R Baseline Assessment

Over the next couple of weeks, Mr Redpath and Miss Goddard will be conducting 'baseline assessments' on our new year children. These are very light touch and only take a few minutes, the children won't even realise that they are being assessed. These assessments will help us to determine what the children already know and what their next steps are. Information about these can be found on the Year R page of the school website but, if you have any questions, please feel free to speak to your child's class teacher.

#### Parking

Over the past week, the school has received several emails and calls from parents and local residents about parking in the village: I have had reports of parents parking in disabled spaces, on pavements, over drop-kerbs and in front of a resident's drive way which meant that they were late for work.

We are all members of the same community and the school relies heavily on the good will of its neighbours – please could I urge all parents to show kindness and consideration when parking your cars.

We generally have some visits from parking enforcement towards the beginning of the year, so please also ensure that you are parking legally.

Please could I ask that, in the first instance, parents only select one club per child (in order to give everyone a chance) and then we'll open up for any additional spaces.
