Illness

I've had a few queries this week about children being in school when they are unwell, so I thought it best just to clarify the school's position.

I think that most people would agree that if a child has a 'minor illness' then there is no reason for them to be missing school but there is a fine balance to be struck — we don't want to teach our children that they should be off school for every little sniffle but neither would be want them to pass on their illnesses to other children and potentially make them ill.

It is probably easier to say when a child should not be in school:

- If they have a high temperature;
- If they have had any bouts of vomiting and/or diarrheoa in the last 48 hours

It is also worth just reminding everyone of the guidance from the NHS about whether or not children should be in school if they are ill - Is my child too ill for school? - NHS (www.nhs.uk).

Parent Consultations and Children's Books

I hope that those of you who have had your parental consultations this week have found these useful; unfortunately, we did have more last-minute cancellations than we normally get.

I strongly believe that one of the best indicators of a child's success in school is the relationship between school and parents; you will have knowledge of behaviours that we may not see at school (and vice versa) and the teachers will have their professional insights into your child's learning and development. These consultations are one of the ways in which we share these and I would urge all parents to make every effort to keep to their appointment as this does have a knock-on impact.

Years 3, 4 and 5 will be bringing home books this weekend. This is an opportunity to look through your child's books with them and ask them what they have been learning about. I would start by asking your child to show you an example of their work that they are particularly proud of and asking them why.

Please could these books be back in school in Monday as we will need these for their lessons.
