Another event that is coming up, is Wear Yellow Day where we raise awareness of (and funds!) Cystic Fibrosis. Many of you will know that we will be having Lucy join Bridge School in September and Lucy's Mum, Sarah, has asked me to share some wonderful news.

You may remember back in November, I wrote to all parents with a plea from Sarah about access to Kaftria and a request for parents to comment on the consultation and even write to the local MP.

I am so pleased to be able to share a wonderful update.













A couple of months ago, Mum wrote to me: Although the NICE decision hasn't yet been finalised, the licensing for Kaftrio has been granted for two years plus Lucy has now been on Kaftrio for a month and the we have seen some subtle changes.

This week in her cystic fibrosis clinic, and for the first time in her life, Lucy's SATs (oxygen saturation levels) were 100, the perfect score. We usually crawl up to 97, 98 if we are lucky; but on Tuesday it went straight up 100! She has also been able to complete a physio blowing activity where she has to try and blow into a tube for a minimum of 3 seconds. Previously 5 seconds was our record but she usually blew for 2/3 seconds. Last week, she was blowing for some 7/8 and even 9 seconds! It's amazing.

Thank you everyone for your wonderful support, particularly at the end of last year regarding the NICE decision.



I couldn't be happier for Lucy and her family and I would also like to add my thanks to Sarah's. We are lucky to be part of such a supportive and loving community.
