Dear Parents/Guardians,

Firstly, we have a lot of sporting success to report with successes in cricket, netball and athletics. The children have written their sport reports which you can find further down. I'd like to express my gratitude to staff and parents who supported the teams.

Price Increases

Whilst undoubtedly unwelcome, we are having to increase the charges for school lunches, breakfast club and after-school club next year.

Over the past couple of years, we have done our very best to try and absorb increasing costs in staffing and food for school meals and Bridge Bees – however we are now at the point where we are having to increase prices as we are making a loss (particularly in our kitchen) and with school budgets being what they are, we cannot afford to do this.

- School lunches will increase to £2.85 a meal
- Breakfast Club will increase to £4.50 a session
- After-School Club will increase to £10 a session

The last thing we want to do is put any additional pressure on family finances at this time but we've held prices for as long as we responsibly could.

Booking Breakfast and After-School Club

With margins very tight, we need to have accurate numbers of children at both breakfast and after-school club and we do have a number of parents who are repeatedly not booking but still sending their children to these clubs; this has a direct impact on our ratios as this can mean that we need to find additional staff at short notice and we are reliant on the goodwill of our TAs for this.

From September, children who attend breakfast and after-school club who are not booked in will be charged an additional 50p per session to reflect the additional staffing and admin time needed to retrospectively process their attendance. We don't wish this to be a punitive measure but it is vital that we have accurate numbers.

House Crests

Earlier this year, we ran a competition for the children to design crests for their respective houses. Whilst we selected our winners quite a while ago, we have been waiting to receive the digitised versions and I personally think that they look great.













Lost Property

We have a great deal of lost property in the school and it is going to be our mission over the next week to return everything to its rightful owner. If there's anything that you know you are missing then please do feel free to check in the school office cupboard.

Library Books

If you have a school library book at home, please could we have this back ASAP. At the moment, we have a few hundred books out and we'd like to get these back and catalogued ready for September.

School Reports

We are just collating all the final documents to send with reports, attendance certificates, etc and these will be coming home on Tuesday next week.

Each year we conduct a short parent survey and I invite you all to complete this again. The results from the survey will be shared with governors (along with all comments) and we will use these to determine our priorities for the coming year. 

Attendance - New Guidance

No one can argue that attendance at school is important and I am pleased that, on the whole, parents are very supportive of this – in fact our school is in the top 10% in the country for attendance and currently we are 7th out of all 431 schools in Kent.

I need to make parents aware about the upcoming changes to the regulations around school attendance. There is new guidance which becomes statutory on the 19th August and, whilst there is a great deal more emphasis on schools supporting parents, there are also increased punitive measures.

I have copied the text below from the statutory guidance.

"From Autumn Term 2024, only two penalty notices can be issued to the same parent in respect of the same child within a three-year rolling period and any second notice within that period is charged at a higher rate:

- The first penalty notice issued to a parent in respect of a particular pupil will be charged at £160 if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days.
- A second penalty notice issued to the same parent in respect of the same pupil is charged at a flat rate of £160 if paid within 28 days.
- A third penalty notice cannot be issued to the same parent in respect of the same child within 3 years of the
 date of issue of the first. In a case where the national threshold is met for a third time (or subsequent times)
 within those 3 years, alternative action should be taken instead. This will often include considering
 prosecution, but may include other tools such as one of the other attendance legal interventions."

What this appears to mean in practice is that if that there is an annual holiday which takes place in term time, the first time there will be a Penalty Notice of £80 per child per parent; the second time the Penalty Notice would be £160 per child per parent and in the third year, the Local Authority would consider legal proceedings. I am still waiting on further guidance from the Local Authority but I have been informed that this will apply retrospectively and take account of holidays from the past two years.

Once I have the guidance from the Local Authority, I will share this with all parents and publish this on the school website but I wanted parents to be aware as I know many of you will be considering booking holidays next year over the summer.
