Drop-Off & Pick-Up Routine

Next week our Year R children will be starting school full-time. In the mornings, if you are dropping off a Year R child, please could we ask that you arrive at school no earlier than 8.45am if at all possible. By this time, most of the children and parents have come through and this will mean an easier and less stressful time for us all.

In the afternoon, parents of Year R children may collect their children from 3.10pm in order to avoid the rush of other parents. However, the other classes will not be releasing their children until 3.15pm so please do not enter the school premises unless you are collecting a sole Year R child – you will not be able to collect children from other year groups.

Please could I also remind parents that they should not drive down School Road without specific permission from the school. This is to ensure the safety of the children as they walk to and from school.

Snacks and Drinks

As we are a healthy school, could I please remind all parents that children's water bottles should only contain water. Ideally they should also be 'spill-proof' so that, if they are knocked over, they won't cause a mess.

Snacks that are brought in should also be fruit or vegetables – cereal bars, crisps, etc. should not come into school as a mid-morning snack.
