Dear Parents/Guardians,

I hope this letter finds you and your family well.

I wanted to share some exciting news about our recent OPAL session and touch on something that's been on my mind lately - our children's mental and emotional wellbeing.

On Wednesday this week, we hosted the first of our OPAL parents sessions, and what a success it was! Approximately 60 parents attended to see OPAL in action, and I heard lots of positive comments throughout the afternoon. It was wonderful to see so many of you there, engaging with what we're doing and seeing first-hand how your children learn and play.

As part of the visit, parents learnt how play is so important to children's mental and emotional health, and this is something that we're all concerned about. Play isn't just fun - it's fundamental to how our pupils develop resilience, creativity, and those crucial social skills they'll carry with them throughout their lives.

Do look out for more opportunities to come and see OPAL in action in the future. I'm sure we'll be running more sessions soon.

Whilst on the subject of children's mental and emotional health, I do want to talk about something else that's been weighing on my mind - children's use of smart phones and access to the internet, specifically social media. More and more, I'm hearing about younger children with unsupervised access to such devices, and I would urge all parents to consider the role that technology is playing in their parenting.

Now, I'm sure we've all been guilty of relying on a screen at times - I know I have! But I am concerned about recent reports that highlight the amount of time our children (and I say this broadly) are spending on their screens. It's not about being anti-technology, but rather about finding that healthy balance we all need.

Coincidentally, this week, I was invited to a round table discussion with Rosie Duffield (amongst others) in September to discuss the impact of smart phones on young people's mental health and wellbeing. This topic is gaining traction, and I think it's an opportune time to review our own approach to such devices - both as a school and as families.
