Dear Parents/Guardians,

We are rapidly approaching the end of the summer term and I hope that your children enjoyed their day yesterday with their new class teacher and teaching assistants. I know that the staff were looking forward to meeting the children and had a positive day.

Yesterday, I met with the parents of our new Year R children and talked about the school and the importance of partnership between home and school and, as we continue to work together to provide the best possible education for all our pupils, I wanted to share some important information with you regarding changes to Special Educational Needs (SEN) funding that will affect our school.

Like many schools across the country, we have been informed of reductions in SEN funding allocations for the coming year. This is a national trend that we are seeing but Kent is particularly affected due to the high cost of SEND provision in the county.

As a larger school, we have been in a better position than many other schools who, over the past couple of years, have had to restructure and lose staff. Last year, we faced losing staff but my work with the local authority brought additional money into the school and we were able to keep staff on – however we are now facing the same challenges that other schools have been facing for the past couple of years.

Our Response

I want to reassure every parent that our commitment to providing high-quality inclusive teaching for all children remains unwavering. Our school vision - *opportunities for everyone to flourish and grow within the love of God* - remains at the heart of everything we do. This vision guides our approach to supporting every child, including those with special educational needs, ensuring they develop their unique gifts and become the best version of themselves.

Despite these funding challenges, we will continue to:

- Maintain our graduated 'assess, plan, do, review' approach for all pupils with SEN
- Work closely with you as parents to understand your child's individual needs
- Ensure teachers feel empowered and supported to make informed decisions about next steps for your child's learning
- Provide targeted support where it is most needed
- Create opportunities for every child to flourish regardless of their starting point or additional needs

We are responding to these challenges in a number of ways:

We have safeguarded class teaching assistants in Years R to 3 and a year group teaching assistant in Years 4 to 6.



Creativity, Excellence, Resilience

We have reviewed our current provision and ensured that we have targeted the TA support to where the greatest need is – focusing on our younger children and classes with greater levels of SEND. This does mean that some TAs will be supporting across more than one class.

We are continuing to invest in our staff's knowledge in SEN provision, ensuring that all teachers and teaching assistants have the knowledge and skills to support all learners.
