

Don't forget to keep practising the tricky words for Phases 2, 3 and 4. These can be found in previous newsletters. You could play a flash card game with the members of your family. Maybe, you could challenge them!

Literacy

- You could write a helicopter story that includes your family or different characters. Perhaps you chose to plant a vegetable in your garden and it grows, and grows, and grows! What do you and your family do? You could act out your new story with your family.
