


This week's lessons on (Summer Week 9) https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-1/ are on developing understanding of numbers to 100. It's important to reinforce the related vocabulary; we refer to each digit as **tens** and **ones**,

and refer to numbers that we say when we count in patterns

as 'made of groups of' or 'multiples of'.
When describing the numbers in a hundred

square it is useful to refer to the columns and rows so that the children develop the vocabulary needed to describe the grid – rather than just pointing.





Tens and Ones



In addition we have attached a 100 square for the children to use to create a board game. This is not the conventional structure of a board game so please take the time to talk about how this differs from a conventional snakes and ladders board. The children will need to create a colour code for their squares or add characters and create a key for the tasks that have to be carried out (E.g. jump on 10, jump back 3, jump forward to the next multiple of 10). We would encourage them to create instructions for up to 20 squares, otherwise the game will get too complicated. Then all you will need is something to use as counters and a dice. You might also like to use the game as inspiration for writing instructions.




