September and Mixing-Up Classes

It is still a long way off, but our minds already need to start thinking about September when our new Year R children join us.

When the children join the school, they are distributed across the school class as evenly as possible according to age, gender and any known educational needs. Historically, the classes have remained so throughout the school however this has meant that some classes have become unbalanced. We would seek to redress this imbalance through mixing up the classes as they enter Year 2 and Year 5; this would be done using the same principles we use when allocating children into classes into Year R, ensuring an even distribution of gender, ability and any educational need.

We feel that this would ensure consistency of provision between the two classes in each year group and allow greater opportunities for social mixing between the classes. Naturally there would be safeguards in place to ensure that a child did not suddenly find themselves without any of their prime social group.
