Dear Parents/Carers,

This week in our Collective Worship we have been learning about People of Faith and sharing stories from the Bible about people who have faith in God and why it is important to listen to Him. ## **Eco-Schools**

This year, we will be thinking more about our environmental impact and what we can do to minimise our impact on the environment.

Whilst the school has, in the past, had an eco-council, I am very keen that this important aspect is integrated properly into the school curriculum and Year 2 and Year 5 will be leading some curriculum development work in order to ensure that all children learn about and take responsibility for eco issues, not just those in the eco-council.



Last week in our Act of Worship, children from Years 2, 4 and 5 gave presentations to the whole school about what they could do to help our planet and I am sure that we'll be hearing more from the children about what we can all do to help the environment.

#### Parent Chat Groups

When children start school, most parents will start or join some form of group chat usually via Facebook or WhatsApp. I would never discourage parents from doing this (in fact, my wife is part of the WhatsApp group for our daughter's class group and sometimes finds it very useful) as it helps keep up-to-date with what's going on, share information and reminders and to build relationships. However, when used inappropriately, these chats can cause problems and I've seen myself where parents have complained or gossiped about the school or staff.

It is only natural that parents may, on occasion, have a concern that they would like addressed but these can only be resolved if they are raised with the school. Comments on social media, particularly when they reference a specific member of staff can be hurtful and damage the relationship between school and home which I have always considered to be a real strength.

# New Entrants (September 2020)

November sees the start of our tours of the school for prospective parents, i.e. those whose children will be starting school next September; we've been running individual tours and these have been very popular.
