Following on from the sad news of Brian's passing, I have some information about the funeral arrangements which I have been asked to share with the school community.

Brian's funeral will take place on Friday 27<sup>th</sup> March at 2pm. Brian was well-loved and respected and, as I am sure you can appreciate, there are a great many members of staff who wish to go and pay their respects.

Whilst the school will remain open for children during the afternoon of the 27<sup>th</sup>, children will be 'supervised' rather than 'taught'. If parents are able to make arrangements for children to be collected at 1pm, it would be very much appreciated as we will be running on a 'skeleton staff' but we will, of course, look after any children who cannot be collected.

Should parents wish to pay their respects, I am told that the funeral procession will pass through Bridge Village on the way to the crematorium and I think it would bring some small comfort to the family to see people lining the route through the High Street.

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## September and Mixing-Up Classes

Following on from my last newsletter, I've received a number of comments and questions about the proposal to mixup classes as the children enter Year 2 and Year 5. I'd like to thank all those parents who have asked questions and expressed their opinions either via email, on the phone or on the playground – I have discussed all of these with the senior leadership team and with the Chair of Governors.

This is a very nuanced issue and the conversations I have had with parents have been around the impact such a move would have on children's learning, resilience, social skills, friendship groups and emotional wellbeing. These have been very interesting discussions and, ultimately, we all want the same thing – what is best for the children.

Whilst there have been parents who have contacted me to say that they think it's a great idea, I think it would be fair to say that most of the comments I have received have been 'we like the idea in principle but feel it's too late for the current Year 4'. I do have a great deal of sympathy with this viewpoint. The children have been together for five years now and, throughout this time, they have always expected to remain together as a group.

Whilst this does not change the potential benefits of mixing-up the classes, I would be remiss by not listening to the concerns of parents and considering the emotional impact on the children in the current Year 4 class.

Schools have a responsibility to act '*in loco parentis*', this means 'in the place of a parent'. However, I prefer to think of parent and school working **together** for the best interests of the children and this can only happen through listening to each other and considering what each other is saying.

Having listened to the views of a number of parents, I propose the following:

- The Year 1 children will be mixed as they go into Year 2. Safeguards will be put in place to ensure an even mix of abilities, needs, genders and social groups;
- When the Year 1 children reach the end of Year 4, they will be mixed once again as this will be the 'new normal';
- The current Year 4 children **will not** be mixed going into Year 5; this recognises the fact that they would have been together for five years and the potential emotional impact on the children;
- The same would apply to the current Year 2 and 3 children the plan would be that they will not mix at the end of Year 4 as they too would have been together for five years by this point;
- However, in recognition of some parents' concerns who wanted the mix, I will be speaking to the teachers about greater work between the classes to encourage children working together across the year group (for example on specific projects).

Whilst it would be impossible to address everyone's concerns, I hope that the above proposal does allay the vast majority of them. I still welcome comments and questions over the coming week but I do seek to make a final decision at the end of the week.
