Our learning this term

In English the children will be focusing on the story of Peter Pan. We will begin by looking at the character of Tinkerbell and working as a class to collect interesting vocabulary before the children write their own character descriptions based on a different character from the story. Followed by writing a new adventure for all of the characters. In all of our work, there will be a focus on handwriting and punctuation. In Maths, we will begin the term by starting a new topic on multiplication and division before moving onto measure. The children will have the opportunity to create moving illustrations in Design and Technology, using levers and mechanisms to link with our learning of Peter Pan. Our topic in History this term we will be investigating the lives of significant people and places both nationally and internationally. We will be comparing aspects of life in different periods including those with a link to Deal Castle (our own locality). Key enquiry skills will be developed through investigation, discussion and questioning. Our PE lessons this term will be Tri golf on a Wednesday and tennis with Stewart on a Friday. In Religious Education, we will be exploring the Big Question "Why does Easter matter to Christians?" We will start by looking at the story of Holy week followed by the Easter story. After this

Games - Can your child guess which word you are thinking of, based on your clues? Can they match the word to the picture? Can you guess the word based on their clues?


Use the word - Making meaning helps us all to remember; if writing a sentence down is hard, talk the sentence out loud.

Mathematics Key Learning Facts

Key aim: To recall multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times table.

Building on from our focus on the 10 times table last term, this term we will be focussing on the 5 times table. The focus will be on quick (inside 6 seconds) recall of the multiplication facts, moving on to understanding the division facts once the child is confident. The best way to practice these facts is to have short 5-10 minutes sessions, e.g. singing songs, calling out the answers in the cars or playing games with parents or siblings.

What are 3 groups of 5? What is 5 times 2? What is 10 multiplied by 5? What is 10 divided by 5? 30 divided by what number makes 2 ? 2 times by what number makes 20?
