We hope that the children have enjoyed the week and are ready for the term ahead. The information below shows some of the areas of learning that we will be covering this term and how you can help support your child at home.

Our learning this term

This term we will be learning all about **The Joys of Toys**. This will encompass our English, Design Technology and History work. We will be sharing the story 'Dogger' by Shirley Hughes and using this as a stimulus for developing our writing skills. We will be focussing on the main character Dave and his experience of losing his favourite toy which will lead to writing our own persuasive letters. In DT we will be exploring marble runs, then designing and creating our very own. Our exploration of a wide variety of modern and old toys will lead into discussion about how toys have changed over time; the children will sort toys according to different criteria, including their age, and begin to learn about time lines and chronology. In Maths we will be continuing our work on addition and subtraction. We will be revisiting our number bonds for numbers up to 10 and learning how these can help us to work out other number facts. We will continue to use these to solve a range of problems, as well as develop our reasoning skills. In Science, we will be continuing our learning about offspring and the different stages of human development alongside exploring life cycles of various animals. In RE we will be exploring the question 'Why does Easter matter to Christians'? Through cricket and tag rugby we will be developing a range of throwing and catching skills, experiencing paired and group work, practising running and dodging.

<u>PE</u>

Our PE lessons this term for both classes will be cricket (on Monday) and tag rugby (on Friday).

Reading

The children appear to have enjoyed the challenge of the **reading stars** and we hope that this continues to motivate your child to read. We count these every week and they are added to the class barometers so please continue to colour in a star on the back of the reading record each time your child reads. Thank you for your support with **Buster's Book Club**. The children have been delighted when they have won the Key Stage and individual awards. The slips will be in the bags every Wednesday and must be returned on Thursday morning.
