Exercise

We are sure lots of you are still keeping active every day in many different ways you may do Joe Wicks every day, go on bike rides or even going on long walks. If you want to try something different, this week we would like you to create your own mini circuit (like we have done at school). You may jog on the spot for 30 seconds, star jumps or even shuttle runs. We are sure you can be very creative in the ideas you come up with, remember only have up to 6 stations and you only need to do each station for a couple of minutes. We have created a circuit for you to have a go at before creating your own:

Station 1

Star jumps for 30 seconds, rest for 30 seconds and repeat

Station 2

How many times can you throw and catch a ball in a minute?

Station 3

Collect 6 toys and two place markers. How quickly can you move the toys from one marker to the next?

Station 4

Place a piece of rope or skipping rope on the floor jump over this as many times as you can

Station 5

Shuttle runs for 1 minute. Place two markers on the floor to run between. How many shuttle runs can you do?


Station 6

Jog on the spot for 30 seconds, rest for 30 seconds and repeat

Yes. Jack frost was being mean because he was jelloss. He didn't tell them because he didn't no how.






We have a new reading challenge for you to have a go at over the next few weeks. There are 6 different activities for you to complete, you may only do 1 but you may decide to do more.

Writing

Our English task this week is a little bit different with a link to what we have been thinking about during Eco time with Year 5. This week you are going to be creating a comic strip and the main character is going to be made out of plastic. A comic strip is a mixture of words and pictures which is a bit like a storyboard. Here is an example of a comic strip about the well-known story Little Red Riding Hood.



What are the key features you can see in this comic strip?

Hopefully you spotted:


- Pictures
- Speech bubbles
- Thought bubbles
- A mini title for example early one morning

Your first job is to watch this video clip but remember to press pause or stop when you need to make your creature made out of plastic.

You then need to find different plastic objects (maybe in your recycling bin) to create a main character for your comic strip it could be a person, an animal or maybe a bird.

Now you have created your main character you are now ready to plan your comic strip you will need to think of a problem and how it is solved. The plan below may help you to think about the different parts of your story.



Once you have created your plan you are ready to create your comic strip. Our top tip is do not draw too many boxes so we suggest a maximum of 6. Remember to include speech and thought bubbles, you may even be able to include some mini-titles to add a little detail on what is happening during your story. Last of all remember a comic strip is very similar to a storyboard we have created before. We have added a 6 box comic strip at the bottom for you to use if you would like.

This week we have moved on to **Summer Term Week 6.** This week we will be revisiting our work on the 10 times table, division and odd and even number. 

Our top tips for division are:

- Count how many groups have been made
- Count how many are in each group
- Remember when writing a division number sentence you always start with the largest number

When you move on to practising your 10 times table remember to count in 10s carefully and look at what is shown in the picture. Here is an example:





How many apples are on each tree? 10


How many trees are there? 3

There are 3 trees with 10 apples on each tree which would be $3 \times 10 = 30$

Each week we will set you a theme to investigate each week. The National Oak Academy is a good starting point and we recommend watching the video first.




