Year 4 - Term 2 Information and key learning

Welcome back to Year 4

Welcome back to Year 4! We hope that you have all had an enjoyable and relaxing half term, we have thoroughly enjoyed term 1 and are looking forward to another productive term learning with new topics. We have a number of events planned this term where the children can engage with their learning in fun and exciting ways. The information below shows some of the new things they will be learning and how you can help support their learning at home. Please do not hesitate to ask any questions you may have.

Our learning this term

Throughout the term, the children will focus their learning on the Mayans. The children will have lots of opportunities to explore the expansion of the Mayan civilization, their language, key moments and understanding the Mayan's place within world history.

In addition, we will be reading and exploring the picture book – Westlandia by Paul Fleischman. For the first half of the term the children will have an opportunity to write a balanced argument 'Should homework be banned?' as Wesley, the main character in this book creates a fantastic Summer project. It will be very interesting to gather different points of view. For the rest of the term the children will be writing a non-chronological report on the Mayans. In Term 2, the children will focus on multiplication and division as well as measurement. They will use a range of manipulatives to show their calculations in a variety of ways. Computing will remain as coding and in RE we will be investigating the big question 'What is the Trinity?'. Throughout the term, the children will continue music lessons with Mr Miles as well as have tennis lessons with Stewart or Ed on Wednesdays.

Key Information

- Dr Clive Nuttman will be coming into Year 4 with his Biology workshop about animals followed by a clay workshop on Monday 21st November and Monday 28th November. The children have always thoroughly enjoyed these days and learnt a lot of new information. Each class will attend one of the above dates.
- PE sessions will take place on Monday (Tag Rugby) and Wednesday (Tennis). With the weather being so variable, please ensure your child has warm layers.
- Our library day is on Wednesday, this is an opportunity for your child to change their reading book for the week. Your child have their own reading record and we expect children to take responsibility for changing their own books, once fully investigated and understood. Please remind your child that the Library is open at lunch times.
- Buster book club competitions continue this term, please record your child's reading time every Wednesday.
- Playtimes: As the weather is changeable, please could all children come to school with a warm/waterproof coat.
- The children may continue to access Times Tables Rock stars website (https://play.ttrockstars.com), a fun way for the children to practise their times tables. This term our focus is on the 6 and 9 times table.
- It can be helpful to access Spelling Shed (https://www.spellingshed.com/en-gb/) to reinforce the spelling rules in Year 4. Every Monday, we will introduce a new spelling rule for the children to practice online, which will then be set as a challenge for most of the children on Spelling Shed.
