
#### Our learning this term

This term will have a Geography focus. Using our geographical enquiry skills, we are going to explore the physical and human features of Bridge and Canterbury. Each class will be having a walk around Canterbury to look at examples of urban development and also to find signs of Roman settlement in preparation for Term 4. This will also link closely to our chosen text in English call 'Tar Beach'. An exciting tale about the hopes and dreams of a young girl. The author, African American, Faith Ringgold is a well-known artist who, as well as being a Civil Rights activist, has spent her life teaching and creating amazing pieces of art related to her experiences. We will be learning more about her in our Art lessons. In maths we will be continuing our learning of multiplying and dividing with 2 and 3 digit numbers before exploring some work on length and perimeter at the end of term. In RE our big question is 'What kind of world did Jesus want?' We will be learning about the Gospel and making links between the calling of the first disciples and how Christians today try to follow Jesus. In Computing, the children will be learning about online safety. PE this term will consist of Yoga, taught by Mrs Saint on a Monday and Dance on a Tuesday. Our Science topic is called 'Animals including Humans'. In Art lessons the children will be making story quilts (using sewing techniques) inspired by the afore mentioned Faith Ringgold.

This term's home learning is also to consolidate the children's knowledge of the eleven times table. We will be looking at times tables in class with an aim for the children to recall these facts instantly.

Children should be able to work out and then instantly recall the following facts. For example

Key Vocabulary	11 x 1 =	11	11 x 7 = 77
	11 x 2 =	22	11 x 8 = 88
What is 8 multiplied by	11 x 3 =	33	11 x 9 = 99
11?	11 x 4 =	44	$11 \times 10 = 110$

	11 x 6 =	66	11 x 12 = 132

They should be able to answer these questions in any order, including missing number questions e.g. 11  $\times$   $\bigcirc$  = 33 or  $\bigcirc$   $\div$  11 = 3
