Welcome back to Year 4



We are looking forward to the new term ahead and have some exciting projects and themes to get stuck into.


Our learning this term

This term we will be exploring the Rainforest in our Geography topic, focusing on the physical features that make up a rainforest, people who make their homes in the rainforest and how these humid habitats are under threat. This will also link closely to our chosen text in English called 'Tar Beach', an exciting tale about the hopes and dreams of a young girl. The author Faith Ringgold is a well-known artist who, as well as being a Civil Rights activist, has spent her life teaching and creating amazing pieces of art related to her experiences. We will be learning more about her in our Art lessons. In these lessons, the children will be making story quilts (using sewing techniques) inspired by the afore mentioned Faith Ringgold. In Maths we will be continuing our learning of multiplying and dividing with 2 and 3 digit numbers before exploring some work on length and perimeter and starting Fractions at the end of term. In RE our big question is 'What kind of world did Jesus want?' We will be learning about the Gospel and making links between the calling of the first disciples and how Christians today try to follow Jesus. In Computing, the children will be learning about Coding and how to use algorithms and programming. PE this term will consist of Dance taught by Laura Andrews on a Tuesday and Rugby on a Monday. Our Science topic is 'Sound' where we will find out about how it travels, pitch and volume. Then investigate materials to see which will provide the best insulation against sound. In JIGSAW the topic this term is 'Dreams and Goals'.

Key Information

- PE sessions will take place on Mondays (Tag Rugby) and Tuesdays (Dance).
- Our library slot is on a Friday morning and this is an opportunity for your child to change
 their reading book for the week. Your child have their own reading record and we expect
 children to take responsibility for changing their own books, once fully investigated and
 understood. We encourage children to read daily, either independently or with an adult, so
 please continue to share and discuss books regularly. There will be lots of opportunities for
 your child to quiz themselves using Accelerated Reader in the classroom.
- Our School reading barometer competition continues this term so please encourage your children to read daily and get their reading record signed in order for them to tick off their name on the class chart.
- Playtimes: As the weather is changeable, please could all children come to school with a warm/waterproof coat.
- To support learning at home the children have access to TTRockstars for times tables

- In addition, we use Spelling Shed (https://www.spellingshed.com/en-gb/) to reinforce the spelling rules in Year 4. Every Monday, we introduce a new spelling rule for the children to practice online, which will then be set ass a challenge for the children on Spelling Shed.

This term's home learning is also to consolidate the children's knowledge of the seven times table. We will be looking at times tables in class with an aim for the children to recall these facts instantly.

Children should be able to work out and then instantly recall the following facts. For example

What is 7 multiplied by 3?	
What is 3 times 11?	

1 x 7 = 7 2 x 7 = 14 3 x 7 = 21 4 x 7 = 28 5 x 7 = 35 6 x 7 = 42 7 x 7 = 49 8 x 7 = 56 9 x 7 = 63 10 x 7 = 70 11 x 7 = 77 12 x 7 = 84

They should be able to answer these questions in any order, including missing number questions e.g. 11 \times \bigcirc = 33 or \bigcirc ÷ 11 = 3
