Year 4 - Term 3 Information and Key Learning

Welcome Back

Welcome back, we trust that you all had a restful Christmas and would like to take this opportunity to wish you a very happy and prosperous new year and thank you for all your gifts. Year 4 are looking forward to the new terms ahead.

Our learning this term

During Term 3, the children's learning will focus on developing key geography skills. Using their enquiry skills the children are going to explore the physical and human features of the USA and in particular the city of New York. This will enable us to compare the features of a city with a village like Bridge. This will link closely to our chosen text in English call 'Tar Beach'. The story is an exciting tale about the hopes and dreams of a young girl. The children will explore the theme of 'freedom' by generating their own story written as a play script. They will then write their own 'Tar Beach' inspired story about their own locality (our geography link). The children will also create a book review, character descriptions and dialogue piece. The author, Faith Ringgold is a celebrated artist who, as well as being a Civil Rights activist has spent her life teaching and creating amazing pieces of art related to her experiences. We will be learning more about her in our Art lessons. Maths in Term 3 focuses on multiplication and the inverse operation of division including multiplying 3 numbers, efficient methods of multiplication, multiplying and dividing 2 digit numbers. In addition, we would continue to encourage the children to use the Times Tables Rock stars (https://play.ttrockstars.com) website which is a fun and engaging way for the children to practise their times tables. In our RE this Term the children will be learning about the Gospel and reflecting on the kind of world that Christians believe that Jesus would want.

Key Vocabulary

What is 8 multiplied by 11?

What is 6 times 12?

What is 36 divided by 12?

They should be able to answer these questions in any order, including missing number questions e.g. 5×60 or $0 \div 5 = 60$.
