

SUPERSONIC Spelling Stars

Reading and spelling common exception words ending with a split digraph.

When you hear the vowel sound at the end of the word, choose to use the split digraph for the sound. Also remember to listen out for other tricky parts that may be spelt differently from how they sound.

Your child is currently exploring common exception words ending with a split digraph. It is important that you child understands the meaning of the word by becoming a "word whizz", is able to put it into a sentence (that makes sense) and be able to both read and spell the word accurately.
