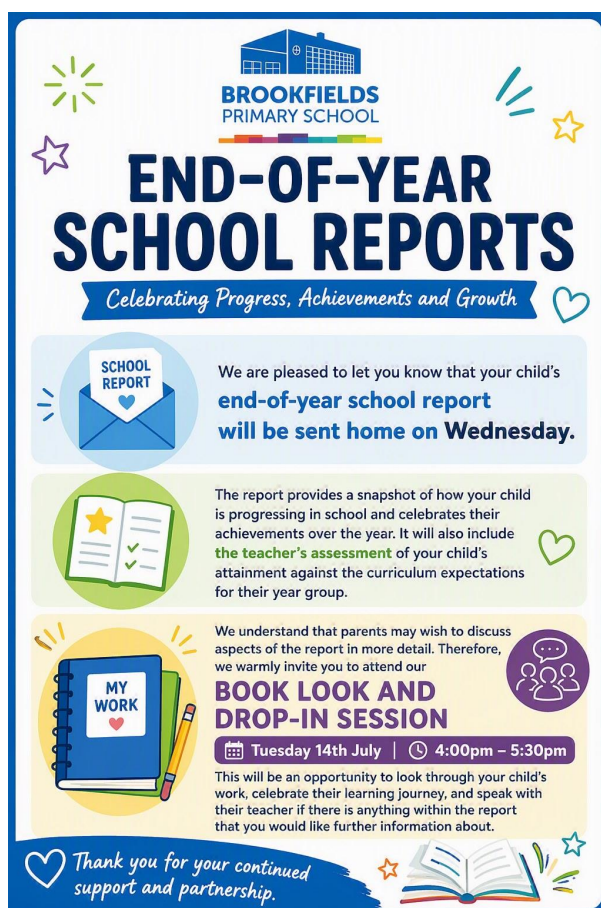

Year 6 SATS Results

We would like to make parents and carers of our Year 6 children aware that there will be a delay in schools receiving this year's Year 6 SATs results.

This is due to an issue with the national online marking system and is affecting primary schools across the country. Unfortunately, this is outside of the school's control.

*As planned, Year 6 end-of-year reports will still be sent home on **Wednesday 9th July**; however, they will not include SATs results, but will include teacher assessment. We will share these with families as soon as they are released to schools.*

We know many parents will be eager to receive their child's results and appreciate your patience and understanding. In the meantime, we would like to congratulate our Year 6 children on the tremendous effort, resilience and determination they have shown throughout the year. Their school report will continue to reflect their achievements, progress and personal development, of which we are extremely proud.

Online Safety - NSPCC

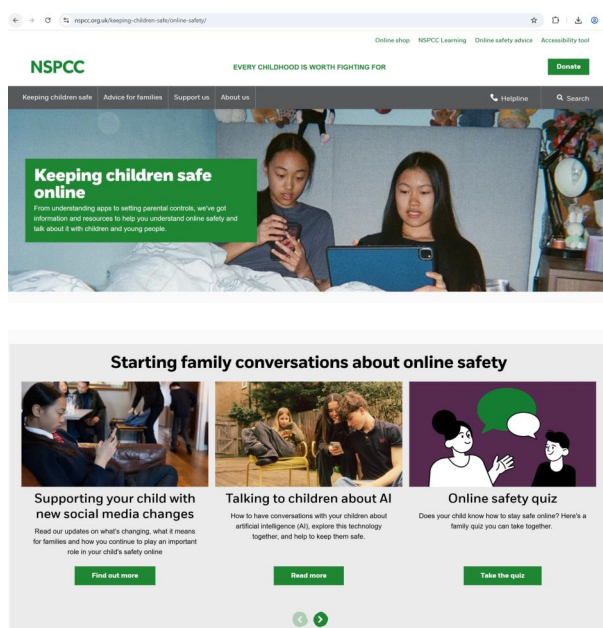
Online Safety for Families
