**Sensory play**, where children explored textures, materials, and hands-on experiences that helped them engage and regulate.

**Creative and imaginative play**, from small-world animals to role-play and construction.

**Outdoor learning**, including movement, balance, riding equipment and exploring the world around them.

**Social play and shared moments**, showing how well the children have learned to be with one another—taking turns, playing alongside peers, and sharing experiences.

**Working with adults**, showing trust, connection, and the positive relationships they have built as they allow us to join them in their learning.

Each child has made wonderful progress—sometimes in small steps, sometimes in big leaps—but always moving forward with courage and curiosity. We are so proud of their resilience, tolerance, and growing confidence in themselves and others.

We ended the term exploring Christmas traditions during history and had fun getting ready for Christmas.
































We have learnt a lot, built fantastic relationships, and made lots of happy memories. The Hedgehogs team wish you a very Merry Christmas x
