This term has been full of exciting learning and exploration for our class. Our focus story, *Colin Lee, Carrot and Pea*, has inspired us to explore a range of vegetables through their colors, shapes, textures and tastes, with lots of sensory experiences along the way. Alongside this, our topic on animals and their habitats has taken us on a journey around the world, where we have explored different animal groups each week, including sea creatures, birds, Arctic animals, and zoo animals. We have also enjoyed taking part in dedicated events such as World Book Day and British Science Week, which brought lots of fun, curiosity, and new experiences into our classroom. Our trips to the local park have been a highlight too, giving us opportunities to explore the outdoors and connect our learning to the world around us.





Our busy bumblebees have been learning through the theme Into the Woods We Go. We have enjoyed exploring different outdoor areas and learning what animals live in the woods. We have constructed trees for the owls and grew our own plants as well as exploring stories linked to the woods, our favourite being Little Red Riding hood. 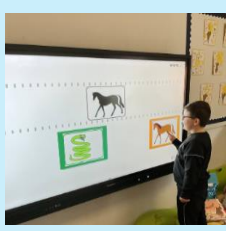

We hope you have a Happy Easter!



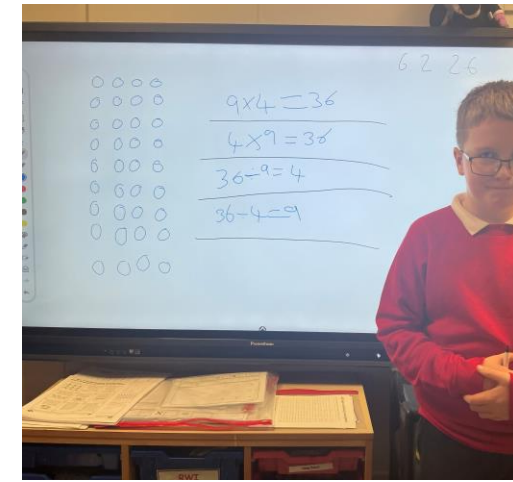
