#### Leave of absence

We would like to remind you that any time off during term time will only be authorised in Exceptional Circumstances. Please consider when you book your holidays and do not book when the schools are open. An 'Exceptional Circumstances' form must be submitted before taking your

child out of school. This can be obtained from the school main reception. If your request for term time absence is refused and your child is still taken out of school, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised and noted on your child's attendance record. A Fixed Penalty Notice may also be issued.

#### Punctuality

We appreciate the efforts that our Parents and Carers make in order to get their children into school on time. Poor punctuality can affect learning and behaviour. The start of the day is when the teacher informs the class of what the day ahead will look like. Learning begins from the moment they enter the classroom. It is not only the pupil who is late that is affected. It has an impact on all other learners if a child walks in late, as the teacher is then required to recap on missing learning for that child.
