Following the success of the campaign in 2024 – when over 80% of schools marked the week, reaching over 7.5 million children and young people – this year, we'll empower children and young people to use their Power for Good to speak out, support others, and build a world where kindness wins. To kick this off, for a bit of fun on Monday 10th, we will be encouraging everyone in school to wear odd socks. At Brookside we spend a lot of our time teaching the children that everyone is different and this makes life interesting and enjoyable, but everyone is equal and we should treat others respectfully. Children in their classes across the school will enjoy a range of learning activities designed to underline the central anti-bullying message which I know you will reinforce at home.

Friday 14th November will be BBC Children in Need Day and as usual the children can come in dressed up or with tweaks to their uniform to reflect the spotty theme and bring in a £1 donation for the charity. There will be a prize for the most 'SPOTacular' outfit for one boy and one girl in each class.
