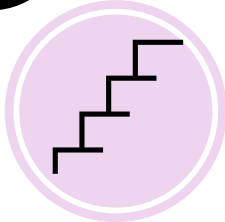
Music

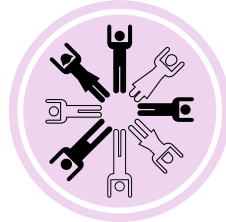
WE AIM TO:

To inspire children to learn new musical skills that they may choose to develop further.



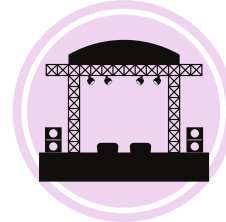
To expose children to music from diverse cultures and periods of history.



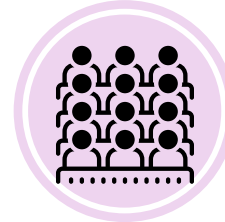
To instil an understanding of the impact of music on emotional and mental well-being.



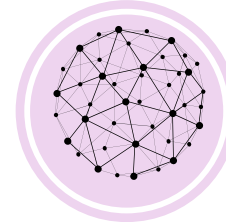
To instil confidence in their ability to create and express themselves through music.

Implementation

HOW DO WE ACHIEVE THIS?

Our Approach:

We see music as a way to inspire our children to connect with their world in creative ways. There are elements of the journey through Broughton Primary School that are 'rights of passage' for our children and we feel it is important to do these justice. These include performances in school shows and the opportunity to see a West End musical on the year 5/6 residential to London. We provide singing opportunities for all children and choir for those who choose to do more and wish to perform. One of our most recent additions is Young Voices, performing in Manchester Arena with thousands of other children as a collective choir. We provide connections for those who wish to pursue instrumental tuition outside of school and encourage performing to peers where desire is shown.

Our Lessons:

At Broughton Primary school, we follow the Kapow scheme of work which provides high quality, well structured, progressive lessons, delivered by our class teachers. Music is taught on an alternating half termly basis so that the children cover six specifically chosen topics each year over 2 year cycle. In years 3 & 4, children will learn to play a tuned instrument for one half term. They will then be offered opportunity to further develop their learning in after school club if they choose. Lessons are a combination of theoretical, practical, visual and auditory learning combined with technology where relevant. Children are encouraged to replicate and create using different tuned and un-tuned instruments and body part using learned skill sets.
