


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

The Behaviour Pathway

Step I -Reminder Step 2 – Last chance Step 3 -Sanction

Step 4 Time Out

The behaviour pathway...

What happens in class?

Step I - Reminder

Verbal reminder and which rule you may be breaking.

Step 2- Last chance

You will be told this is your last chance and what the sanction will be if you continue.

Step 3 - Sanction

Lose a dojo/team point and sanction will be given from the behaviour ladder.

Step 4 - Time out

If you still continue the behaviour after the sanction, you will have time out. This might be in a different class or the headteacher.

Repair

If you get to Step 3 or Step 4 you will be asked to have a chat about your behaviour with the member of staff.

The behaviour pathway...

What happens outside?

Step I - Reminder

Verbal reminder and which rule you may be breaking.

Step 2- Last chance

You will be told this is your last chance and what the sanction will be if you continue.

Step 3 - Sanction

Lose a dojo/team point and sanction will be given from the behaviour ladder. You will stand on the behaviour wall for 2 or 5 mins.

Step 4 - Time out

If you still continue the behaviour after the sanction, you will have time out. This will be with a member of staff inside.

Repair

If you get to Step 3 or Step 4 you will be asked to have a chat about your behaviour with the member of staff.

Rewards



OVER AND ABOVE

We will only reward the children showing 'over and above' behaviour.

DOJO MESSAGES

Be mindful to send quick messages home to parents about positive behaviour, think when was the last time you sent a parent a positive message?

LUNCH WITH THE LEADER

Children will still get the golden sweatshirt each week, but when they do, they will also get 'lunch with the leader' on a Monday. Children will have an early lunch at 11.45 and get to sit on a table with Anna (Emily if Anna not avail) and get juice etc. Staff can gain this too, if you go over and above.

TEAM POINTS

We are still going to use dojo/team points system for childrne who go 'over and above'. The team who wins the most week will receive half-termly treats on a Friday afternoon from 2pm-2.45pm.




