We look forward to welcoming our pupils and their families to this joyful occasion of celebration and recognition. While this evening highlights the achievements of selected prize winners, we fully recognise that many more pupils show commitment and excellence each day. That said, we are proud to celebrate pupil success throughout the year and strive to ensure that all who deserve recognition are acknowledged in some way. We sincerely apologise if anyone has been unintentionally overlooked.

#### **Parental Communications Policy**

We would like to inform parents and carers of our updated Parental Communications Policy, which now includes the introduction of our new school telephone system. This advanced system features the latest technology designed to improve efficiency and enhance communication. One of its key functions is the ability to record telephone conversations, which helps ensure clarity, accuracy, and accountability in all interactions. We encourage all families to familiarise themselves with the updated policy, which is available in full on the school website.

# **Attendance and Holidays in Term Time**

We would like to remind all parents and carers that, in line with government legislation, holidays during school term time are not permitted unless there are exceptional circumstances. Every school day counts, and regular attendance is vital for your child's education and wellbeing. As per the national framework introduced in August 2024, schools are required to issue a fine when a child has missed 10 or more sessions (equivalent to 5 school days) without authorisation. Fines are issued per parent and currently stand at £80 if paid within 21 days, rising to £160 if paid within 28 days. If a parent receives a second fine for the same child within a three-year period, it will automatically be charged at the higher rate of £160. After two fines, further legal action such as a parenting order or prosecution may be considered, with court fines reaching up to £2,500.

#### Uniform

Thank you for your continued support in ensuring your child wears their school uniform smartly and correctly. The vast majority of our pupils arrive at school looking smart, remain so throughout the day, and leave in the same manner. Where uniform issues do arise, they are typically linked to two areas: skirts and shoes. Skirts should not be rolled up and must sit naturally just above the knee, in line with our uniform policy. Footwear should also meet the school's published guidelines, which can be found in the **Information section** of our website. To support with consistency, we hold a supply of appropriate school shoes and will issue these to any pupils who attend in unsuitable footwear.

Ahead of the summer break in July, I will write again with a clear guide on acceptable footwear, along with reminders about expectations for hair and jewellery as we prepare for the new term in September. If you have any questions or would like support in this area, please contact Miss Mault, Deputy Headteacher for Behaviour and Pastoral Care.

# **School Hours**

Our business hours are 8.00am - 3.45pm. Staff are not expected to be available in the evenings or weekends. We recommend using the schedule send function outside of these hours to stop staff being prevented from marking and planning, or spending time with their families.



# **Response Time**



We want our communication to be timely as this is in the best interests of our pupils and will aim to respond to parents/carers in 3 working days. The greatest challenge we face is the high volume of communications we receive. We will prioritise communications based on need, but must stress that we cannot operate as an emergency service.

# Language

There is no place for aggressive behaviour or threatening language. Those who adopt this manner, or are rude to staff, will not receive a response. Any visitor to school who adopts an aggressive tone will be asked to leave the premises.
