This event is so important in our school calendar, allowing an opportunity for parents to come and experience our fantastic school and the outstanding relationships that make us so special. There will be no dinners served on this day but there will be more substantial snacks available in the mid-morning break. Students entitled to Free School Meals can draw down their allowance at morning break on this day.
