### **Recognised Rewards**

We are thrilled to share that Miss Oldham has received a national award for outstanding SEND provision—a testament to her incredible dedication and hard work. Additionally, our entire school community has been recognized with a national award for attendance, reflecting the importance of working together to support excellent attendance across the school. Attendance is vital for pupils' progress and enjoyment of school, and this recognition is a result of the shared commitment of staff, pupils, and parents. We want to thank you, our parents and guardians, for your crucial role in encouraging and supporting regular attendance—it truly makes a difference. Well done to everyone for this fantastic achievement!

#### **Beacon Award**

Last year, we introduced out very own recognition award for pupils that work hard and contribute both inside and outside of school. The award highlights opportunities for pupils to contribute to our school and wider community by living out our Gospel values and "letting their light shine." The award encourages pupils to step outside their comfort zones and develop new skills and interests. There are 3 stages of the award: Bronze, Silver and Gold and work in a very similar way to the Duke of Edinburgh Award, but more for Year 7, 8 and 9 pupils. Pupils have to complete tasks in order to get elements of the award "signed off"; this can include attending a CASEO club or enrichment opportunity, a club outside school, participating in a charity afternoon or Mary day activity and receiving Hope, Patience and Justice positive awards. It was fantastic to see over 50 pupils achieve the Bronze Award in its first year. Please encourage your child to get involved and see what colour award they can reach by the end of Year 9. How many will be distributed this year at church in our end of year celebration on Friday?

## **Rewards Trips**

It is superb to see so many pupils receiving rewards for their hard work, dedication and commitment to school. Over 400 pupils have accessed trips to Level, The Trafford Centre and Manchester Markets. Well done to all. If it wasn't to

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be this time, there are new opportunities to get involved next term as the count for criteria starts again after Christmas. <u>Christmas Market</u> - Many thanks to all who supported our Annual Christmas Markets. Our school hall had a buzz of festive celebration and merriment with over 40 stalls selling beautiful gifts and food. Father Christmas visited too and with his band of happy elves worked hard to discern those on the good list! A total of £1,066 was made in support of St Catherine's Hospice; a great achievement.

<u>Christmas Jumper Day</u> – Our Christmas Jumper Day this year was the best supported yet with over 200 pupils wearing their jumpers. Thank you for all who brought a tin in as a donation to our local food bank at St Aidan's Church.
