### Adverse weather notifications

During the winter months, adverse weather conditions may occasionally impact our ability to open the school site safely. We ask that pupils attend school dressed appropriately for the colder weather, including wearing a warm coat, to ensure their comfort and safety throughout the day. In the very rare event that adverse weather conditions mean the school is unable to open safely, families are asked to check the school website, which will always provide the most accurate and up-to-date information. We kindly request that parents rely on the website as the main source of guidance in these circumstances. Where necessary, parents will also be contacted via Firefly. Should the school be closed physically, learning will continue online, with work set through Microsoft Teams, and all pupils will be expected to engage fully so that learning can continue with minimal disruption.

These occasions are an essential part of how we work together to support pupils, providing time for meaningful conversations about progress, effort, and next steps in learning. Regular attendance at Parents' Evening is vitally important, as it allows families to gain a clear understanding of how their child is developing academically and personally, and how best they can be supported at home. This is especially crucial for our Year 11 pupils as they prepare for key examinations and make important decisions about the months ahead. When parents and school staff work in close partnership, pupils benefit from consistent messages, shared expectations, and a stronger sense of support. We strongly encourage all parents and carers to attend these evenings, as this shared commitment plays a significant role in helping pupils to achieve their potential and continue to make positive progress. We look forward to welcoming you into school over the next few months.

### Charity

We would like to extend our sincere thanks to our entire school community for the remarkable generosity and compassion shown in supporting those less fortunate. Since September, an outstanding total of over £3,000 has been raised for a range of charitable causes — a truly impressive achievement that reflects the strength of our shared values. Through our continued support of Operation Christmas Child, run by Samaritan's Purse, families donated over 60 thoughtfully filled shoeboxes to children in need across the world. Our Annual Christmas Markets

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brought the community together in a wonderful celebration, raising £1,604.33 for St Catherine's Hospice, while Christmas Jumper Day saw pupils donate generously to the local food bank at St Aidan's Church, resulting in over 10 boxes of food for families in our area. Staff and pupils also played their part through Christmas Karaoke and the sponsored Santa Dash, with pupils raising an additional £434, including some exceptional individual efforts. Together, these acts of kindness demonstrate the powerful impact of working as a community to support others, and we are incredibly proud of everyone involved.

We hope to sell as many books as possible as this enables us to earn free books to further enrich our school library.
