The past few weeks have seen our lay chaplain, Rachael, introduce a brilliant charity to our pupils which we will be supporting this year in our pledge to raise awareness of our School of Sanctuary Award work. Mary's Meals is an organisation that provides school dinners in parts of the world where they are desperately needed to ensure children have the energy required to tackle the school day. Rachael has delivered assemblies outlining the work Mary's Meals has done in countries like Lebanon, Myanmar, Ecuador and Haiti. Careers

Empowering our pupils with the knowledge required to take their next steps in life after school is important to us at Brownedge, and our Careers programme is a key part of that. Attendance

We are delighted at the significant number of pupils who have maintained a 100% attendance, with many winning the 'Weekly 100 prize' as well as being on course to achieve their Silver 100 Club badge at Easter; high standards of attendance is truly commendable. We are also delighted to have welcomed Mrs Carrera to our team, as our

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Attendance Manager. Mrs Carrera is working closely with Mrs Doherty, our attendance officer, to track and monitor attendance and punctuality, as well as work with our families to support improvements where necessary. If your child is unable to attend school, please report their absence to our attendance team on the morning of absence otherwise it will be categorised as unauthorised. It is important to note that unless unavoidable, do not arrange medical or dental appointments during school hours as these count against attendance. As we move forward, it is essential to establish good habits and ensure 'loss of learning' is kept to an absolute minimum. Pupils who have an attendance of 90% or below, and should this pattern continue through their academic life, could miss the equivalent of at least half

an academic year of learning. As a school we are passionate and committed to high standards of attendance and the

support of you as parents is integral to achieving this.

In assemblies last week pupils were reminded of our expectations on prohibited items in school. Once again, we highlighted the consequences of bringing/using eCigarettes, lighters, eScooters and laser pens into school. This will not be tolerated in any circumstance. We continue to uphold our high standards relating to the use of mobile phones. Can I remind parents, as we have pupils, that our school rule states that phones must be switched off during the school day. Phones are not to be used as a means of telling the time. We are currently adding to our school behaviour policy the inappropriate use of smart watches linked to phones. We are seeing an increasing number of pupils using smart watches to communicate with others. If these watches are used in this manner, then the mobile phone sanction will be put in place.
