#### **NEWSLETTER 7**

This is always such a busy half term and we move at pace towards Easter. As I mentioned in my previous newsletter, we begin this week to celebrate the season of Lent and as a Catholic school it is a special time where we focus on three pillars: **Prayer, Fasting** and **Giving**. This year in each week of Lent, we are asking pupils to engage in an activity associated with each of these three pillars. **Prayer** is central to our daily pattern of life in school, and this will deepen during this special liturgical season. **Fasting** is usually associated with food, but this year we are asking pupils to consider other ways that they may fast, for example from technology, from wasting the earth's natural resources, from anger and from ignorance. Finally in terms of **almsgiving**, pupils will spend time raising money for St Joseph's Penny Box, for the homeless in creating "Care Packages" and CAFOD in our Big Lent Walk. The pinnacle of our almsgiving will take place at our annual Charity Afternoon and our House forms are busy preparing activities to raise money for various charities during this hectic, but fun filled afternoon. #### **Pilgrims of Hope**

You may be aware that Pope Francis has declared 2025 as a year of Jubilee, something which happens every 25 years. The theme of the year is "Pilgrims of Hope". The central message is to actively cultivate and share hope in a world filled with suffering from the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of COVID-19 pandemic and climate crisis. It is a time for reflection, renewal, and spreading hope, where individuals are invited to undertake a personal "pilgrimage of hope" through prayer, acts of charity, and deepening their faith. Pupils were introduced to the theme at the start of the new year and school has been busy planning a year-long programme of activities for our school community to engage in.



One such activity is Brownedge hosting the diocesan 'Anchor of Hope'. This Anchor has been provided by Bishop John and is on its own pilgrimage around the Salford Diocese. In total it will visit 37 schools. We will receive the Anchor from St Mary and St Benedict's RC Primary School and after it leaves us, it will journey on to St Paul's RC Primary School in Feniscowles, Blackburn. We will officially receive the Anchor of Hope on 12<sup>th</sup> March. On Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> March, we will hold a school Mass and members of our community, parents and parishioners are welcome to join us. More information will follow very soon.
