Summer Examinations Years 7 to 10

Our summer examination period for Years 7 to 10 is fast approaching. Year 7, 8, 9 and 10 will begin their assessments on Monday 16th June. Over the next five weeks, pupils will continue to work through their curriculum content both in class and through homework tasks to ensure they are well prepared. To support effective revision, regular written homework for Years 7 to 10 will pause after the May half term. This will allow students dedicated time to review their learning, strengthen their understanding, and build confidence ahead of their assessments.

Interfaith Week starting 19th May

In the last week of this half term, we will be marking our Interfaith Week – a special opportunity to celebrate the rich diversity of faiths and beliefs within our community. As a Catholic school, we are rooted in the values of respect, compassion, and understanding, and Interfaith Week allows us to live out those values in a meaningful way. Through a range of activities, discussions, and reflections, pupils will be encouraged to explore different faith traditions, deepen their appreciation for others' beliefs, and recognise the shared values that unite us. It is a time to build bridges, celebrate our common humanity, and affirm the strength that comes from being part of a truly inclusive and respectful school community. At the end of the week, we will celebrate our annual Mary Day, where Year 7 to 10 pupils will participate in a day of House-based sessions on Mary, our patron saint. Pupils will finish school at 2pm; should this time be an issue or if any pupil has difficulty in getting home at that time, please inform school and we can make arrangements for them to stay in school until the end of the normal school day.

High Expectations - the reintroduction of the Uniform Card

I know that when we set high expectations for pupils in terms of attendance, punctuality and behaviour, they rise to them; they accept that what we do is to support their development and instil good patterns and practices for their future. This was evident when our pupils, through the School Council voice, asked us to reintroduce our Uniform Card. This will begin on Monday and will allow us to reward students who consistently present themselves excellently, whilst ensuring all strive towards our high standards following school uniform rules, such as appropriate skirt lengths, shirts being tucked in and no jewellery. We know that we are preparing students for future employment and rules that they will need to adhere there. Following rules is an important element of our students' education -and I thank parents for their continued support on this.

Holiday Requests

It is at this time of year I get increased numbers of parents requesting holiday leave. This year we have had a staggering 114 requests for leave of absence during term time. Taking of holidays during term time is highly discouraged and with the new Government legislation, it is unlikely that any holiday request will be authorised.
