# **Holocaust Memorial Day**

And then 8 days packed with snow, fun and laughter came and went - but what a truly memorable trip in every way, and an unbelievable way to start 2023. 37 pupils and 5 staff met at 8.30am on Thursday 9th February as we said goodbye to Brownedge for eight days and began our journey down to Heathrow. No time for shopping as getting a party of 43 through an airport is no mean feat, and by the time the last bag had been checked in, we were called for boarding!

Off we went up to snowy New Hampshire on the East Coast and Kancamagus Lodge. The first day quickly came and went, however a further treat was to come for the pupils... snow tubing! The evening of day one then allowed our pupils to test their skills at a different winter sport, Ice Skating. Helmets and gloves on, we let one hundred pupils and some staff loose onto a freshly polished ice rink. Needless to say, the scenes were more Bambi on Ice than Torvill and Dean! We had pupils skating on bums, hands and knees and bellies.













Day two had perfect skiing conditions, and the pupils thrived. Their skiing was definitely improving, as were their falls as a result of the increased speed, with Evie proving that humans really do bounce! Day Three started and it was now clear that our pupils had some real skiing ability, and this continued to develop across the next three days. Stories of blue and black diamond slopes being conquered were banded across the whole group and it was brilliant to see all enjoying their time on the mountain.

Day 4 provided a break from the snow, but allowed us to take in the breath-taking views across the White Mountains of New Hampshire. A truly spectacular sight, and one that will live in the memory for all pupils and staff. The evening brought a little extra treat for the pupils, as they walked to the local high school to watch a basketball play-off game.









Day 5 and a hearty breakfast of pancakes, bacon, eggs and not forgetting Mr Crusham's favourite - Lucky Charms - prepared all for the final day of skiing. Students were now regularly skiing black diamond runs, venturing to the top of the mountain and enjoying the packed powder that the overnight snow had left us. A truly memorable and magical last day.

5.30am was their wake up call on day 6 and the holiday was clearly catching up with the pupils as we had two very sleepy coaches on the journey to Danbury Fair Mall. Three hours later, retail therapy began, with the Apple store getting the brunt of it. However, it was lovely to see that the pupils had not forgotten the contribution the parents had made, with Pandora, perfume and aftershave being popular amongst the pupils as gifts to say thank you. Then, it was back on the bus for the final leg of our journey into New York City.

Bright lights and tall buildings left our pupils in awe of the magnitude of this wonderful and iconic city. Times Square was buzzing with life and street entertainers. After some food at the Hard Rock Cafe, pupils hit Times Square for an hour of shopping before making the short walk to the Empire State Building. Up to the top we went to witness the magnificent views on a spectacularly clear night. Memories well and truly made!

An early start again allowed us to catch the Staten Island Ferry and visit Lady Liberty on Liberty Island. Our students then paid their respects at the 9/11 memorial, before one final surprise as the pupils were treated to a journey to the One World Observatory, allowing them to see the city during the day with unrivalled views of Liberty Island and the Empire State Building.

Throughout, the pupils were a credit to their parents/guardians; hopefully, we created lasting memories for all. 




# Geography Interhouse Competition


# Netball




#### Lent 2023
