School of Sanctuary

At the latest School of Sanctuary network meeting in October 2023, there was a celebration as Brownedge St Mary's became officially recognised as a School of Sanctuary, a special status awarded for developing a culture of inclusiveness and support.

We were presented with a certificate in recognition of our achievement by Jeff Morgan (The City of Sanctuary National Trustee) on behalf of the national City of Sanctuary movement. We joined the Lancashire cohort of Schools of Sanctuary as the twelfth school receiving this status.

Schools awarded this status help pupils, staff, parents and the wider community to understand what it means to be seeking sanctuary. They also extend a welcome to everyone as equal, valued members of the school community.

Welcoming displays around the school which help new arrivals to settle in are present in most of Schools of Sanctuary. All schools have induction programmes for newly arrived children and a buddy system that meets the needs of children seeking sanctuary is in place. Negative myths surrounding refugees and asylum seekers have also been dispelled in these schools. Each school engages in positive and enthusiastic activities involving their own pupils and parents, and others from all over the world. We are very proud to be recognised in this way.

Mr Brooks' Science Club have taken part in a number of exciting activities this term. A lot of their work has revolved around the science of sweets, where they've been doing things such as investigating crystalline structures of chocolate and how they affect the flavour and melting points of the chocolate, and investigating how changing the amount of cocoa products in chocolate affects the flavour and melting point. In addition, they've also worked on a project to build a launch device to accurately fire a ping pong ball into a target across the laboratory, while they've also investigated the electrolyte concentration of energy drinks using an electrical conductance probe they built. Switzerland Hadron Collider Trip

The Science department organised a three-day visit to Geneva in November. We visited the Large Hadron Collider, where we were privileged to have access to the huge underground CMS experiment. We travelled across the 27km particle accelerator into France for over half an hour by coach, before descending 330 feet underground to the vast cavern which holds the particle detector. Three scientists working on the experiment full-time designing new instruments were our expert guides for the afternoon. They were able to introduce us to the amazing world of particle physics.

We made a separate visit to the CERN gateway visitor centre, a brand new £90 million interactive visitor experience which includes Tim Berners Lee's original computer, the first ever internet server, amongst other amazing exhibits. We visited the historic heart of the Old Town and four other museums in Geneva to see some remarkable impressionist art, extraordinary wildlife exhibits and scientific experiments, including a battery made by Allesandro Volta as a gift to Napoleon.

We also shopped Swiss style for our food and chocolatey souvenirs, and we travelled by motor cruiser to an island on the lake to sample the ultimate Swiss treat, fondue. Very stylish!

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Mrs Duggleby's Creative Writing Magazine club produced some excellent work this term. Create Education

Create Education work with BAE to deliver part of BAE's Education programme. BAE provide schools with training, a 3D printer and a 3D scanner so as to improve pupils' employability in the new sectors of this new technology. 60 of our Year 8's were trained two years ago and 60 of our Year 9's have completed the training day this year. These skills are developed in lessons and in CASEO clubs after school. Thank you to Create for your work with us.



STEM Club



The CASEO STEM club is run as part of the BAE Challenge. Teams have to design and prototype using the 3D printer. The brief is to design a prototype product (or a part for a product) that will either: help in one small way to improve the environment in or around a local waterway (river, canal, lake or sea) OR improve the habitat for one or more species of local wildlife. The teams will enter the competition in 2024 so it can be judged by BAE. Winners will be announced in 2024.
